The Burn is a small country estate at the foot of Glenesk on the border between Aberdeenshire and Angus in NE Scotland. At the heart of the estate is a magnificent Georgian mansion house dating from 1791. Originally the home of General Lord Adam Gordon, Burn House has been extensively remodelled and is now a very comfortable and spacious property that works exceptionally well as a group venue.

For over 160 years Burn House served as a fine family home. Then, in 1949, Mr and Mrs George Herbert Russell gifted the house, 200 acres of land and an endowment to the Dominion Students' Hall Trust (now Goodenough College) in memory of their son James who was killed in action in 1944. James was just 21 when he died and his parents wanted Burn House to be used by students.

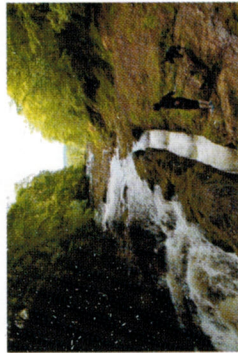
Since 1950 The Burn has operated as an academic retreat and student holiday centre. It continues to attract students from across the world and is routinely used by university reading parties and special interest groups from Europe and the UK.

The Burn has 26 bedrooms and can offer full-board or self-catering accommodation throughout the year at very competitive rates.

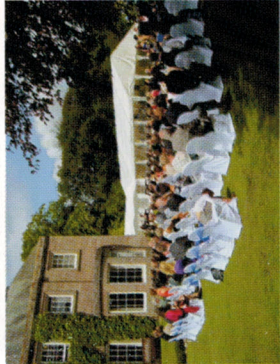
The Burn is Best for:
